<p>Lesson Overview</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Analyse the key features of Pop Art.• Analyse and experiment with techniques used by Lichtenstein, Warhol and other pop artists to create tone in their work.• Experiment with ideas for lettering style, techniques for tone and imagery relating to Pop art.• Develop a 2-colour lino design including dark tone, mid tone and highlight, based on a portrait with strong contrasting light and shadow• Experiment with 2-colour lino printing and different repeat patterns developing skill.• Work collaboratively as part of a team to create a large scale repeating lino print with mixed media pop art style lettering	<p>Key Words</p> <p>Pop Art -1950's Art movement, based on modern culture, mass media and consumerism.</p> <p>Culture - the ideas and way of living of a group of people.</p> <p>Mass media – ways of communicating, (such as newspapers, radio, magazines or television) that is designed to be seen by a lot of people</p> <p>Consumerism - spending money and consuming goods that are manufactured</p> <p>Tonal/tone-the light and darkness of an object. A range of tones can be used to record patterns of light and shadow, to make a drawing look 3-dimensional.</p> <p>Contrast – strong difference between things, opposites, e.g. black and white</p> <p>Collaborate – work jointly on an activity or project</p> <p>Mixed media – using at least 2 materials in a piece of work.</p>
