There are more than 1 billion Catholics worldwide. The Roman Catholic Church is led by the pope. The pope rules the church from Vatican City, which is a separate country inside Rome, Italy.</p> <p>Martyr: someone who sacrifices themselves (dies) for a cause (something they believe in).</p> <p>Peasant: a Medieval farmer who farmed small strips of land. They were at the bottom of the Feudal System and had to obey their lords.</p> <p>Plague: a disease that spreads very quickly.</p> <p>Pope: the head of the Catholic Church.</p>
