DIT 	<p>Key Words</p> <p>Darshan- Viewing with respect a holy image</p> <p>Puja - worship</p> <p>Mandir - Hindu place of worship</p> <p>Meditation - the practice of stilling the mind and removing ordinary thoughts, developing deep concentration and wisdom through power of the mind</p> <p>Shrine – A sacred space in the home, temple or outdoors where a deity is worshipped</p> <p>Holi – The Hindu festival of colour</p> <p>Diwali –The Hindu festival of lights</p> <p>Murti – an image of a deity used as a focus for worship</p> <p>Varanasi – the most famous site of pilgrimage in India</p> <p>Kumbh Mela – Largest pilgrimage site in the world</p> <p>Worship – acts of religious praise</p> <p>Liturgical worship – a church service which follows a structure</p> <p>Non-liturgical worship – a service that does not follow a set structure</p> <p>Prayer - communicating with God</p> <p>Sacraments – rites and rituals which the believer receives the gift of grace</p> <p>Baptism – ritual which involves water as a symbol for washing away of sin and becoming a Christian</p> <p>Holy Communion – sometimes known as Eucharist or Mass. A service which remembers the last supper of Christ</p> <p>Pilgrimage – a special religious journey</p> <p>Festival – a day or period for celebration for religious reasons</p> <p>Christmas- the day remembering the birth of Jesus</p> <p>Easter – the religious season remembering the death and resurrection of Jesus</p>
