Christian and Hindu Practices Assessment</li> </ol>		<b>Key Words</b> <b>Ahimsa</b> -Non-violence <b>Bhagavad Gita</b> - An important and popular scripture for Hindus, which explains why god came to earth in the form of Krishna <b>Convert</b> – someone who has decided to be religious or move from one religion to another <b>Evangelism</b> – spreading the gospel by public preaching or personal witness <b>Vedas</b> - Some of the oldest sacred scriptures of India <b>Meditation</b> - the practice of stilling the mind and removing ordinary thoughts, developing deep concentration and wisdom through power of the mind <b>Mission</b> - going out and spreading their faith and beliefs to others <b>Upanishads</b> – part of the oldest scriptures in Hinduism – containing ideas about Brahman <b>Persecution</b> – hostility and ill-treatment, especially because of race or political or religious beliefs <b>Reconciliation</b> – restoring relationships after they have broken down <b>Murti</b> – an image of a deity used as a focus for worship <b>Guru</b> – a wise teacher of religion and spirituality <b>Yoga</b> – a form of meditation and worship <b>Dana</b> – giving <b>Sewa</b> – selfless service and the name of a Hindu charity
