Times when religious programmes are shown on TV  <b>Forms of Media</b> - Television, Radio, Newspaper, Internet, Soaps, Books  <b>Freedom of Speech</b> - The concept of being allowed to say what you want, no matter how distasteful, without threat of punishment or imprisonment  <b>Magazine Programmes</b> - Programmes which show a mixture of news, reviews and interviews with people in religious news, they are more likely to be on the radio, but TV programmes sometimes have magazine sections  <b>Media</b> - A form of communication  <b>Moral Issues</b> - Something which is regarded as the right thing to do by some people, and as the wrong thing by other people. E.g. Racism, divorce, abortion, euthanasia, cohabitation...  <b>Portrayal of Christians in the media</b> -How Christians are presented in the media. How they come across. E.g.—Dot Cotton/ Ned Flanders.  <b>Religious Broadcasts</b> - Everyman Programme, Songs of Praise, Witness, Heart and Soul, Religious documentaries and Magazine programmes  <b>Soap Opera</b> - A television or radio drama series dealing typically with daily events in the lives of the same group of characters  <b>Pornography</b> - the explicit description or showing of sexual activity  <b>Evangelism</b> - 'Evangelise' literally means 'to spread the good news'. Christianity is a proselytising religion i.e. it goes out to make converts.</p>
