Film Study – Slumdog Millionaire 			Key Words <p>Charity - A means of giving (usually money) in order to help the less fortunate</p> <p>Christian Aid - A Christian charity organization that provides money, equipment, advice etc. in order to help poorer countries develop their farming and industry</p> <p>Debt- Something, typically money, that is owed or due</p> <p>Exploitation - The act of making use of a situation to gain unfair advantage for oneself</p> <p>Fair Trade - Trade in which fair prices are paid to producers in developing countries</p> <p>Immoral Occupation - There are certain industries and companies that Christians would not work for because they believe they do wrong things</p> <p>North/ South Divide - The idea that the northern hemisphere is considerably richer and more developed than the south</p> <p>Poverty- The state of being extremely poor</p> <p>Stewardship - Stewardship is a theological belief that humans are responsible for the world</p> <p>Immoral - The wrong behaviour or way to act</p> <p>Moral - The right behaviour or way to act</p>
