<p><b>Lesson Overview</b></p> <p><b>Lesson 1</b> – Sexuality and sex before marriage</p> <p><b>Lesson 2</b> – Contraception and family planning</p> <p><b>Lesson 3</b> - The nature and purpose of marriage and cohabitation</p> <p><b>Lesson 4</b> – Divorce and remarriage</p> <p><b>Lesson 5</b> – The nature of families</p> <p><b>Lesson 6</b> – Gender equality</p> <p><b>Lesson 7</b> – Revision</p> <p><b>Lesson 8</b> – Assessment</p> <p><b>Lesson 9</b> - DIT</p>	<p><b>Key Words</b></p> <p><b>Adultery</b> - having sex with someone you are not married to.</p> <p><b>Annulment</b> - the cancellation of a marriage.</p> <p><b>Civil marriage</b> - non-religious marriage ceremony.</p> <p><b>Civil partnership</b>- the legal union of two people of the same sex.</p> <p><b>Celibacy</b> - not having sexual relationships.</p> <p><b>Chastity</b> - keeping yourself sexually pure e.g. no sex before marriage.</p> <p><b>Cohabitation</b> - living together as a couple.</p> <p><b>Contraception</b> -precautions to prevent pregnancy and STDs.</p> <p><b>Divorce</b> - legal ending of a marriage.</p> <p><b>Extended family</b> - a nuclear family plus other relatives, living with the family e.g. grandparents.</p> <p><b>Family</b>- parents and their children as a group.</p> <p><b>Gender Equality</b> - the idea that men and women are equal.</p> <p><b>Heterosexual</b> - someone who is physically attracted to the opposite sex.</p> <p><b>Homosexual</b> - someone who is physically attracted to the same sex.</p> <p><b>Monogamy</b>- having one husband or wife.</p> <p><b>Nuclear family</b> - mum and dad plus children</p> <p><b>Polygamy</b>- having more than one wife at the same time.</p> <p><b>Procreation</b>- the biological process of a couple producing children.</p> <p><b>Remarriage</b> - marriage a second time after a divorce.</p> <p><b>Single parent family</b> - a family of either a mum or dad, plus children</p> <p><b>Vows</b>- promises made in a wedding ceremony.</p>
