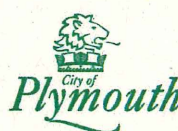
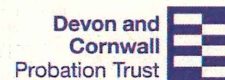

- Appropriate support processes can then be established by multi-agency partners resulting in a considered, balanced and proportionate response that ensures the most appropriate level of support is provided.
- There is no single profile of a person likely to be involved in terrorism or violent extremism. However, experience has shown that there can be early warning signs most likely to be identified by family, friends and professionals which are indicative of the need for support.
- The earlier we can identify and provide appropriate support, the more effective this support is likely to be.
- You can be reassured that any information received will be handled sensitively and treated in the strictest of confidence.
- *Where SPOC exists and in line with any internal risk management and information sharing processes.
