Key words

Charity -Voluntarily giving time or money to help people in need.

Discrimination -Actions that come from prejudice attitudes. **Equality**-Belief that everyone is equal in value and worth. **Exploitation**-Treating and paying people unfairly.

Fair pay- Payment that is appropriate for the work done.

Freedom of religious expression-The right to freely practice religion without discrimination or punishment.

Homosexuality - Being physically/sexually attracted to persons of the same gender.

Human rights-The rights a person should be entitled to simply because they are a human being, eg education, fair treatment etc.

Interest -Money paid back on loans in addition to the original amount borrowed.

Justice-Fairness; working to fix an unfair situation.

Loan-Amount of money borrowed from a lender, usually paid back in installments with interest.

People trafficking-Illegal transport of people from one country or area to another, often resulting in forced labour or sexual exploitation.

Positive discrimination/action-Positive discrimination is favouring a person or group to try and rectify negative treatment in the past

Poverty-The state of being without the things needed for a reasonable quality of life, so that day-to-day living is a struggle.

Prejudice-Negative thoughts, feelings or beliefs about a person (prejudging them) based on a characteristic they have, e.g. their sexuality or ethnicity
