Use annotation to explain your creative journey.</b></p> <p><b>Assessment Objective 4- Use your research and experimentation to bring your work to a final conclusion/piece(s) linking imaginatively to your theme</b></p>	<p><b>Key Words</b></p> <p><b>Illustration:</b> a picture illustrating a book, newspaper, etc.</p> <p><b>Monoprint:</b> A print pulled in an edition of one. There are no series of identical prints that are signed and numbered.</p> <p><b>Printing Press:</b> A device used by a fine art printmaker to produce prints one copy at a time. It applies pressure between a sheet of paper and an inked printing plate</p> <p><b>Registration:</b> Adjustment of separate plates, blocks, screens or paper in color printing to ensure correct alignment of the colors.</p> <p><b>Relief:</b> A technique in which the image is printed from a raised surface.</p> <p><b>Relief Print:</b> A means of making prints by creating a raised design on a flat surface. The design is inked or covered with color and stamped on paper or another surface.</p> <p><b>Screen Print:</b> A form of stencil printing in which the stencil is adhered to a fine screen for support.</p> <p><b>Stencil:</b> A printing process by which areas are blocked out to keep ink from non-image areas.</p> <p><b>Lino Print:</b> A type of relief print in which the image is cut into a piece of linoleum.</p>
