Tactical – having a plan or strategy in order to do something.

Attributes – what qualities do individuals possess.

Responsibilities – taken ownership of what is your duty to do.

Interpretation – what you think might have happened and how you see the situation.

Decision making – making choices about the actions you perform and why.

Analysis – being able to look at a situation and reflect on what has happened, then back up with information or fact.
