Key Words

Audience- are the main target audience who receive the communication directly.

Brief- an organization that produces theatrical performances.

Devising - A form of theatre where the script originates not from a writer or writers, but from collaborative work by a group of people.

Media- a group of people viewed as a whole rather than individual.

Platform- represents the different ways to communicate an idea and to build a dialogue with your audience.

Storytelling- is the description of ideas, beliefs, personal experiences, and life through narratives that evoke powerful emotions and insights.

Style – The manner in which something is created or performed.

Techniques- are used in performances to attach specific meaning to it. When a technique is used repeatedly in a drama the audience recognise its significance.

to suit your skills and understanding.
