Adultery - having sex with someone you are not married to.

Annulment - the cancellation of a marriage.

Civil marriage - non-religious marriage ceremony.

Civil partnership- the legal union of two people of the same sex.

Celibacy - not having sexual relationships.

Chastity - keeping yourself sexually pure e.g. no sex before marriage.

Cohabitation - living together as a couple.

Contraception -precautions to prevent pregnancy and STDs.

Divorce - legal ending of a marriage.

Extended family - a nuclear family plus other relatives, living with the family e.g. grandparents.

Family- parents and their children as a group.

Gender Equality - the idea that men and women are equal.

Heterosexual - someone who is physically attracted to the opposite sex.

Homosexual - someone who is physically attracted to the same sex.

Monogamy- having one husband or wife.

Nuclear family - mum and dad plus children

Polygamy- having more than one wife at the same time.

Procreation- the biological process of a couple producing children.

Remarriage - marriage a second time after a divorce.

Single parent family - a family of either a mum or dad, plus children

Vows- promises made in a wedding ceremony.
