Prakriti – matter/ the material Samsara - rebirth Saguna – God in form. Brahman with qualities Sanatana dharma – eternal law Shaivism – Branch of Hinduism that looks to Shiva as the main manifestation of the Divine Tri-guna – the three qualities of all matter Vaishnavism - Branch of Hinduism which looks to Vishnu as the supreme manifestation of the Divine</p>
