Lesson 1 – Introduction to relationships	<b>Adultery</b> - having sex with someone you are not married to.
Lesson 2 – Sex before marriage and contraception	<b>Annulment</b> - the cancellation of a marriage.
Lesson 3 – Homosexuality	<b>Civil marriage</b> - non-religious marriage ceremony.
Lesson 4 – Christian marriage	<b>Civil partnership</b> - the legal union of two people of the same sex.
Lesson 5 – Arranged marriage	<b>Celibacy</b> - not having sexual relationships.
Lesson 6 – Divorce	<b>Chastity</b> - keeping yourself sexually pure e.g. no sex before marriage.
Lesson 7 – Families	<b>Cohabitation</b> - living together as a couple.
Lesson 8 – Assessment	<b>Contraception</b> -precautions to prevent pregnancy and STDs.
Lesson 9 - Film study – License to Wed	<b>Divorce</b> - legal ending of a marriage.
	<b>Extended family</b> - a nuclear family plus other relatives, living with the family e.g. grandparents.
	<b>Family</b> - parents and their children as a group.
	<b>Gender Equality</b> - the idea that men and women are equal.
	<b>Heterosexual</b> - someone who is physically attracted to the opposite sex.
	<b>Homosexual</b> - someone who is physically attracted to the same sex.
	<b>Monogamy</b> - having one husband or wife.
	<b>Nuclear family</b> - mum and dad plus children
	<b>Polygamy</b> - having more than one wife at the same time.
	<b>Procreation</b> - the biological process of a couple producing children.
	<b>Remarriage</b> - marriage a second time after a divorce.
	<b>Single parent family</b> - a family of either a mum or dad, plus children
	<b>Vows</b> - promises made in a wedding ceremony.
