#### Reading Strategies

## Explore connections:

- In what ways does this text remind you of anything else that you have read?
  In what ways does it follow the conventions of this type of text and add to what you already know?
- Is this text relevant to something happening in the world now or in the past?
- Are you able to relate to the viewpoint or the information within the text?

### Question:

- Why does the author portray that character/event/information in that way?
- What questions do you have?
- What would you like to know more about?
- How did this text make you feel?
- Why does this text make you feel this way?

### Understand:

- Are there any unfamiliar words?
- Do any of the words remind you of any words you already know?
- Reread the word and sentence to see what other words would fit.
- Look the word up if you still cannot decode its meaning.
- Transform the text/information into a format you find easier to understand (mindmap/storyboard/iMovie/PPT/Book Creator/PicCollage)

## Imagine/Infer:

- What can you see?
- What can you hear?
- What clues from the text help you to create your mental image?
- Can you describe the picture you have created in your head?
- How did the pictures that you have created help you to understand the text?
- What feelings and meanings are suggested but not implicitly stated?

#### Predict:

- What clues can you get from any visuals and graphics in this text?
- What might happen next?
- What clues help you to make this prediction?
- Has your prediction been confirmed?
- Do you need to modify your prediction?

# Skim, Scan and Summarise:

- Skim the text (read rapidly) to obtain a general overview of it.
- Scan the text (zoom in) in order to find specific facts.
- Re-tell the main ideas of the text in order.
