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



## Anti Social Behaviour



Dear parents and carers

We appreciate many of our local students are respectful and a credit to our community. But over the past few weeks Falmouth town centre and particularly the area around Prince of Wales Pier has been subjected to large scale ASB on Friday and Saturday evenings by students from the local area. The students congregated on Prince of Wales Pier and the surrounding area. The students involved have been putting themselves at risk by abusing drugs and alcohol, being abusive to members of the public, being violent towards each other, and abusive to officers who attended to deal with the ongoing ASB.

This behaviour affects the whole community and will not be tolerated. We would like parents to talk to their children and not only know their whereabouts but to actively discourage this type of behaviour via discussion of the consequences. If the young people are involved and then prosecuted for offences like this, it can influence their life choices and it can prevent certain careers and even travel options. We will not only look at prosecution but will consider imposing conditions using ASB legislation to control the company of those involved, and where they can and cannot go, to prevent re-offending. There will be a zero-tolerance approach to any ASB.

We believe that parents and carers play a vital role in guiding young people towards positive choices. We ask that you:

- Speak with your child about the seriousness of ASB and its impact on others.

- Encourage respect for community spaces, property, and people.
- Contact us if you have concerns or require guidance on how to address these issues at home.

No parent wants their child to have a criminal record. We therefore encourage you to speak to your child about the potential consequences. We want our young people to enjoy their weekend, stay safe and behave in a social manner so the whole community can enjoy Falmouth.
