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Uniform Reminder



Thank you to all families who work with us on school uniform. Our students are looking smart, and we appreciate your support in maintaining our high standards. Here are some simple reminders from our uniform policy:

Jewellery:

- One plain stud earring per ear only (plain silver or gold, less than 5mm diameter)
- No facial jewellery - nose studs, spacers, hoops, or other facial piercings are NOT acceptable

Make-up:

- Discreet, minimal, and natural make-up is permitted
- NO false eyelashes

Nails:

- Natural coloured nail varnish only
- NO false nails or acrylic nails
- NO nail extensions

Not Permitted:

- Excessive make-up
- Body art (pen/ink marks, tattoos, including henna)
- Bandanas or hair scarves
- Nose studs, spacers, or hoops

Thank you for your continued support in helping our students look smart and feel proud to be part of Penryn College.


Potential Medics Group

It has been a busy few days for the potential medics group. On Thursday we had three 3rd year students in from Exeter University- they gave us a run down of their journey into medicine and how they are enjoying their time in Cornwall as part of their degree. Then they gave us a couple of tricky ethical questions to think about introducing our year 10s and 11s to the 4 pillars of medical ethics- which run through any medical career. Thank you to Ellie, Emma and Sareena who were so enthusiastic and to Dr Scott who facilitated the visit.

This was followed on Monday by Matt Thomas from Cornish Paws who ran a lovely 'hands on' session learning to suture using bananas- It turns out that it is far harder than it looks ! Matt was able to answer questions as the student practised stitching and emphasised the importance of perseverance when looking for veterinary work experience. Thank you very much Matt for giving up your time and letting the students have a go at a skill that is relevant to all our potential medics.

The potential medics group is an information hub that is aimed largely at the older year groups, but is also open to everyone - so if there are any KS3 students with a strong drive towards a medically related degree please come and talk to Mrs Alsop in person or join the group via showbie - code DYACV.

We are hugely grateful to the parents and members of the local community who give up their time to provide our students with these enrichment opportunities, and I am always very happy to hear from anyone who may be able to offer something for the potential medics group. In the run up to options evening, Year 9 have been considering where a language could take them and watched a series of videos in which different business leaders from the world of sport, technology, politics, tourism, charities and music, talk about how having a language has helped them in their careers. This morning, we were lucky enough to have Lori, from Mingalaba (<https://www.mingalaba.co.uk/meet-the-team>) talk to Year 9 about the importance of languages if you want a career in the world of professional sport, be it as a player, manager, coach or a behind the scenes role. As a former employee of Arsenal, she was able to share her experiences of travelling the world with a Premier League football team and how her languages helped her in her career. She spoke about the wide range of international sponsors and companies she has worked with subsequently and how the transferrable skills acquired through studying a language are so important.
